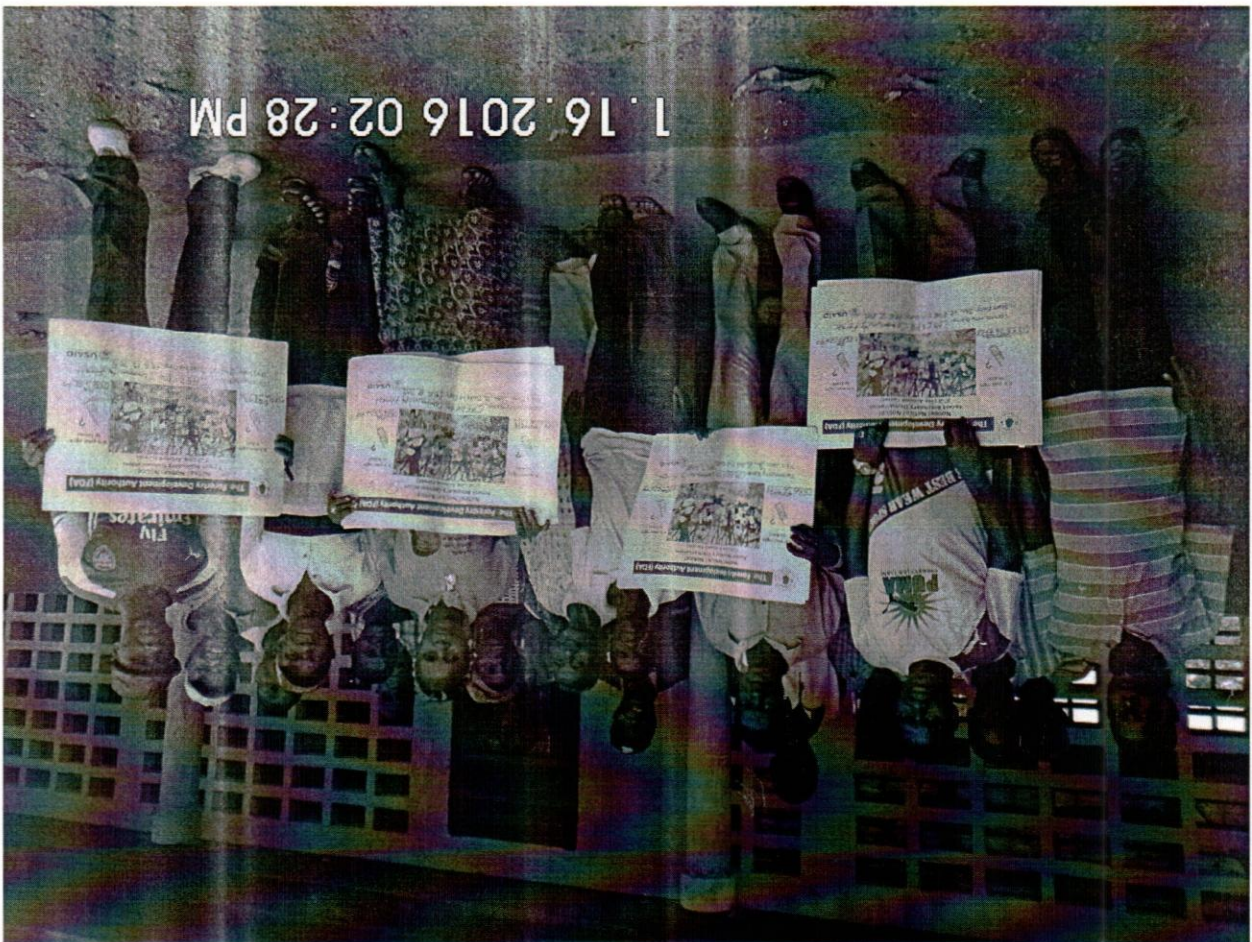

On November 13, 2015, a team of technicians from FDA, EPA and ACORD namely: Weedor H. Gray, Manager, Extension Services & Mobilization, Arthur R. Mallobe, Cartographer/GIS Division, Cletus N. Togba Manager, SED Research & Development, Jarsa V. Okai, EPA, Abraham Day, ACORD, Soko Y. Koryon Regional Extension Officer Community Dept. Region #4 and Wilson Limin, Driver were dispatched to River Gee to conduct SFR survey in three communities listed above.  
 Official communications from the FDA Management were delivered to the County Authority of River Gee upon the arrival of the team in the County. The SFR survey was conducted for 15 working days to

acquaint the citizenry on FDA mission to the County in Jarkaken town for Chedepo and in Gbeh Town for Kiteabo Chiefdom. Subsequently, the team was welcomed by the various Hon. Commissioners and the citizens of Chedepo and Kiteabo Chiefdom Community.

**Mission Specific Objectives**

To conduct the socio-economic and reconnaissance survey and the posting of a 30days demarcation and mapping survey notice for each applicant community's forest.

**General Objectives:**

- The social, economic and reconnaissance survey is carried out to;
- Introduce FDA and her key partners to the applicant community;
- Create an environment that would enable FDA to directly learn from communities so that subsequent actions are likely to be more rooted, more productive and in harmony with what is already happening in the communities in terms of natural resources management and use, and related areas;
- Credibly and correctly plan and situate forest management activities as such as to take on board pertinent concerns and aspirations of communities (clients) about their resources and environment;
- Gauge the level and kinds of interests of every sector of the community to establish a community forest, and to raise awareness in planned activities; to ensure that free prior informed consent is secured and foster interactive participation of residents;
- Define, select and rank priority issues, opportunities and challenges in the context of forest resource management and use, local governance structures, social capital, threats to biodiversity and existing knowledge about climate change and its impact
- Obtain a broad view of local capabilities, assets (material, social/institutional) and power dynamics.
- Develop baselines which can be used to monitor, review and evaluate policies/by-laws and program

**Participants:**

Estimated attendance at each community was above 45 including women, youth and elders. At some venue, observers from nearby communities were in attendance as a result of their zealousness to acquire a community forest management status.

**Constraints:**

- Mobilizes were in consistent in information sharing regarding dates and time of the conduct of the exercise which obliged the SFR team members to jointly form part of the mobilization of the community people to have the SFR survey start on time. This situation occurred on separate occasions at two separate venues.
- Feeding of participants at the community level resulted to creating undivided attention at some time when people were hungry and there were no sign of feeding availability.
- Bad roads condition.
- Community in readiness/late arrangement to feed themselves during the exercise.

**Observations:**

- During the mission, the team observed;
- Participants were in full attendance
  - Participants demonstrated their interest in the exercise which is an indication of their willingness to go through the nine (9) steps of the CRL.
  - Some towns and villages were destroyed due to the civil crisis.
  - Forest close to the communities was destroyed by farmers.
  - One of the towns (Jarkaken) in Chedepo District did not show interest in the survey exercise.

**Conclusion:**

At the end of the exercises, the community members and local authorities appreciated the FDA team for the education on the various steps of the CRL which give raise to the Social Economic Survey for applicant communities and the posting of the 30 days notice for demarcation and mapping survey. The SFR exercise was well done and the local leaders hope to see FDA team for the next step which is step 5, and that is demarcation and mapping survey as soon as possible.
